#### **Covid 19 Notice**

Bishop McKeown has written to us this week, following further guidance, specific to churches, from The Executive Office. He made the following points:

- Once the churches are open again, it is important to reduce the risk of transmission of infection in the indoor environment of churches. We are advised that social distancing remains the most important mitigation of risk. This is relatively easily controlled in the church building but can break down as people leave the church and even gather outside; this has to be carefully managed. Other important mitigations include ventilation (open doors and windows) and face coverings in church.
- If a person tests positive for COVID-19, and has been to church within the relevant timeframe, the Public Health Authority (PHA) will contact the parish only if it deems it necessary to advise on any steps that have to be taken.
- Anyone who is feeling unwell or already displaying symptoms of COVID-19 should **not** attend Mass or Services in church.
- Within the church building, it is important to minimise movement of the congregation as far as possible.
- The call of the Church Leaders for face coverings to be worn in church is to be encouraged (noting that some people are exempt).
- In relation to the anticipated higher demand for places at Mass over Christmas, over-crowding must be avoided. Additional Masses can be put on, with cleaning and ventilation of the church between each Mass. There should be clear communication with parishioners about numbers and associated planning. There is a concern, from the perspective of public health, of the increased inter-generational mixing at Christmas. The people most at risk are the over 60s and people with underlying health conditions.

Christmas, while a joyful time of Christian celebration, will be a challenging time for parishes. Please God, with the advent of widespread vaccination, we can look forward to improving circumstances as we move towards the Springtime of 2021.


#### Parish Draw 2021


