Covid 19 Restrictions

Bishop McKeown sent the following message to the priests of the diocese on Wednesday 14th October 2020 for our attention:-

This morning, additional restrictions were announced by the Executive, arising from the COVID-19 pandemic. There are some differences from the overnight media reports.

As they apply to churches, the following are the additional restrictions:

1. Churches remain open, but people **must** wear masks to enter or leave the church – this is mandatory;

2. Funerals and Weddings are restricted to only 25 people. It would appear that this restriction does not apply to other Masses or Services.

I understand that there is to be further clarification of the details of the new restrictions. Once these are released, they will be forwarded to you. It is always possible that any such clarification may modify the contents of this message.

The restrictions apply from Friday 16th October 2020.

Wedding Receptions are not permitted. This is not of direct relevance to church celebrations. The First Minister referred to the restrictions as being within “Regulations”. The difference between Guidance and Regulations is that the latter are legally enforceable. The above restrictions apply for a period of four weeks. However, there are doubtless further twists and turns ahead.

Covid 19 Advice for Parishioners

- During this time, it is vitally important that we maintain the 2 metre distance rule - this is important at all times, including entering and leaving church and outside the church while awaiting entry.
- It is also very important that all parishioners co-operate with ushers.
- There must be no more than three (3) persons to a seat, or one (1) family unit. Individuals must keep 2m apart in the seat.
- You will be greeted on arrival at the church and invited to sanitize on entry and requested to go to the usher who will direct you to your seat.
- Avoid queuing – come early and allow additional time for arrival at church.
- Enter the church through the Church Street doors where sanitizing stations are in place in each porch. The church will be filled from the front to the back and emptied from the back to the front. Please follow the directions of the usher at all times.
- Masks are now mandatory in the Church, so all parishioners are asked to observe this at all times.
- We appeal to anyone who is experiencing any Covid symptoms, to please stay at home, in order to protect others.
- Please be aware that this is a constantly evolving situation, and more restrictions or regulations could be in place soon. We will keep you updated through our newsletter, website and facebook page.
