Irish Bishop welcomes Pope Francis' message to elderly, grandparents



Bishop Denis Nulty, chair of the Irish Bishops' Council for Marriage and the Family warmly welcomes Pope Francis' message for the first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, and is encouraging parishes to celebrate the occasion.

“As a society we have learned a lot from their stoicism and pragmatism in the face of so many challenges.”

Unsung heroes

Bishop Denis Nulty described grandparents and the elderly, including older priests and religious, as among the “unsung heroes of the pandemic.”

The first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly will be celebrated on the 25 July on the theme ‘I am with you always’ (Mt 28:20).

Welcoming Pope Francis' message to mark this World Day, Bishop Nulty says that in it, the Pope “reminds us of the need for the whole Church to be close to all the elderly and grandparents at this time of pandemic.”

Mission to encourage

The Bishop points out that throughout his papacy, Pope Francis has urged people to value their many gifts.

In his theme chosen for this inaugural event, “the Holy Father is highlighting that promise of closeness that generations share with each other,” says Bishop Nulty.

He goes on to say that “Not only are our young people called to be present in the lives of older people, but so too grandparents and elders have a mission to encourage young people on their faith journey.”

He is with us always

Referring to the text of the Pope's message, issued on Tuesday, the Bishop of Kildare and Leighlin notes that Pope Francis gives his assurance that he has been “close to all those who have felt isolated and alone in recent months and that, even at the darkest of moments, the Lord continues to send angels to console our loneliness and to remind us that ‘He is with us always’

Walk for Nuala

A 5k Walk in memory of the late Nuala McLaughlin will take place on Sunday 4th July 2021. Nuala was a native of Glencull, Ballygawley and she was a Family and Child Care Social Worker with the Western Trust when she passed away as a result of Covid-19, aged 43, in December 2020. She was cared for by the committed staff in the Intensive Care Unit in the South West Area Hospital, Enniskillen and her family are now inviting people to take part in this walk in Nuala's memory, to raise funds for the Intensive Care Unit and also Child Support Services which was a cause that was close to Nuala's heart.

Resumption of Hearing Aid Support

RNID is resuming its free drop-in support session for hearing aid users in Omagh Community House, 2 Drumragh Avenue, Omagh on Wednesday 30th June from 11-1pm.

The socially distanced drop-off and pick-up service provides new batteries, cleaning and retubing of ear moulds for NHS hearing aids. Hearing aids must be placed in a labelled envelope with name and contact details. They will be collected at the entrance by a volunteer and brought inside for maintenance. Users can wait in their car or return later to collect hearing aids. Hearing aids can also be dropped off by friends or family members. The sessions are run by trained volunteers and funded by the Health and Social Care Board.
